Additional Opportunities

Trauma-Informed Psychological and Spiritual Care in Indigenous Contexts – 2/13-14, 2019: Sioux Falls Seminary, the North American Institute for Indigenous Theological Studies, and Sioux Falls Psychological Services will partner together to offer this two-day workshop. The primary faculty will have connections to NAIITS and will engage us in conversation from an indigenous theological perspective integrated with good psychology. Possible topics to be discussed include: colonization, contextualization, historical trauma, transgenerational trauma, epigenetics, Doctrine of Discovery and other historical realities, role of the Church in causing harm, indigenous-informed spiritual care, psychological approaches to care, etc.
